

Now the biggest maize maze ever

A KINVER tourist attraction is looking on the bright side after heavy rainfalls caused a bumper crop.

The Maize Maze at Kinver Edge Farm is the creation of farmer Ian Sadler, who first put in 120,000 plants on a two-and-a-half acre plot in April 2005.

Mr Sadler and his family now grow the maze every year next to their Kinver Farm Shop in Sandy Lane, close to Kinver Edge. And this year's crop has grown to five feet high and covers about five acres — the biggest yet. The theme for visitors this summer is Discover Canada.

Good exercise

Mr Sadler said there were all sorts of Canadian characters hidden away in the maze — lumberjacks, mounties and wolves. He added the maze was not just for kids as it was a good exercise for anyone.
